

RISK ASSESSMENT GUIDELINES

WHAT ARE THEY & WHEN SHOULD THEY BE CARRIED OUT

A risk assessment should be carried out at each venue that is booked to host a training sessions or competition event.

The risk assessment allows the organiser to identify any areas within the venue that may have the potential to cause harm. You should also identify the level of risk, if any. By identifying potential risks we can take every precaution to prevent and avoid harm to others.

A risk assessment should be made before the start of the training session or event. This is to ensure that the venue is safe for the intended activity.

If a potential hazard is noted, you should directly approach the venue management asking that this be rectified before progressing with the delivery of the activity. If an area of the floor space/classroom is required to be sectioned off, then this will be acceptable.

The primary aim is for the activity to go ahead within a safe environment.
