## Welcome to the Netball Scotland Annual Report 2021/22.

It's been yet another challenging year for us due to the continuing impact of COVID-19 but yet again, you, our fantastic members, have risen to the challenges and recreated existing, or created new, netball opportunities across Scotland.

Thank you to everyone who coaches, umpires, and administers the game, and to our inspiring CEO, Claire Nelson, and the staff team, without whom we wouldn't be where we are. We appreciate all the time and effort you all give to the sport we love. During the year our Chair, Ed Crozier, stepped down. We would like to thank Ed for the contributions he made to the Board during his tenure.

Despite the challenges we faced there have been some wonderful highlights during the year such as the first competitive match in 985 days for the Thistles when we hosted Barbados and won the two test matches; the VNSL Super Saturday Arena event with a massive home match for Sirens in front of 4,000 fans following a full day of Scottish Cup competition finals, both showcasing brilliantly the talent we have in the country.



The work led by NS President, Freda Hutchison, to safeguard our netball heritage and archives which included tracking down and meeting some of the first Thistle players from the 1950's; and the first steps towards men and boys being more involved as netball players.

## Partnerships are critical to Netball Scotland,

and we would like to thank **sport**scotland for their continuing support and guidance, as well as the other organisations we have built successful relationships with across Scotland. Going forward we want to enhance and develop those relationships further; ensure financial stability to lessen the continuing impact of COVID-19; strengthen and diversify the Board; and ensure that we deliver the highest standards of governance.

Every one of our **members** is important to us and we hope that you continue the journey with us as we strive to positively **transform netball in Scotland**. We are always seeking ways to improve and hope that you take opportunities to give us feedback during the year.

Finally, we hope that you can come to one of the European World Cup Qualifiers that we are hosting in October at the Emirates to cheer on the Thistles and support them on their campaign to get to Cape Town in 2023.

## DEAR MEMBERS,

If we thought the 2020/21 Season was a massively challenging time for us all, the 2021/22 Season didn't hold back in packing it's punches too! Whilst we were able to finally return to playing, developing and watching our sport, it was not without disruption, uncertainty and at times disappointment. But once again, our netball family met those challenges head on and through collaboration, creativity, resilience and innovation and we have now emerged out of what we all hope is something we can put firmly behind us.

## The **lifeblood** of our sport - our staff and volunteers

- have gone above and beyond to return netball to our courts at both a community and an elite level, and I know how much it has meant to all of our members and athletes to get back to the sport they love after such a difficult time. For this effort and dedication I am truly grateful.

Our focus this last season has been wholly on the return of our sport, and despite some false starts at the beginning of the year, we are delighted to say that all but one of our local Leagues managed to get back up and running in some capacity. On top of that, we managed to run our National Cup competitions resulting in our biggest and most professional Finals day ever where all of our finalists got to experience the thrill of an Arena event by playing on the show court here at the Emirates before a Sirens home game.



The teams, from U13 right through to Open age group, were all treated to our full professional sports presentation experience whilst their supporters proudly watched on from the stands. I'm so delighted with what we were able to put on for our Clubs and Members, and am proud to say that we have delivered the best National Finals day in UK netball. A huge well done to our Head of Netball, Rebecca Hope, for bringing the vision for this event to life and best of luck to her as she returns home to Northern Ireland after 7 fantastic years with the business.

We finally got to enjoy the return of International netball and live spectators in December last year when we hosted Barbados in a test series in the Emirates. The BBC covered our games, and we launched a new partnership with Carbon Jacked to offset the carbon footprint of Barbados' air travel through tree planting. We were pleased the get three strong wins from three and handed out some new caps for the first time as well. This Test Series was part of our Scottish Thistles preparation for the Commonwealth Games and under the leadership of Tamsin Greenway and Sara Francis-Bayman we were incredibly proud and inspired watching our new look team take to court in Birmingham over the summer. We have a bright future ahead of us and will now really accelerate our Thistles training and competition programme in order to ensure qualification for the Netball World Cup in South Africa next summer where we will strive to finish in the top 8.

and to welcome the awesome Sirens Tribe back into the Arena to deliver one of the VNSL's best game day experiences. Our team never failed to inspire us on and off the court, and with the introduction of new digital expertise and resource into the business, we were able to reach and engage with more people than ever before helping keep Sirens positioned as one of the most engaged with brands in world netball.

Off the court, we have strengthened our organizational structure with the appointment of a COO, the creation of new specialist Heads of Growth and Netball roles, and through the introduction of Netball Development Officers on the ground. As we head into the final year of our strategic investment cycle and emerge out of the most challenging two years our sport has ever experienced, it is critical that we have the structure and expertise within the business to not only recover, but to more importantly build the sporting infrastructure and pathway that will enable our sport to grow and thrive. We are still as ambitious as ever, but the financial challenges that we face have never been greater, so the need for innovation, partnerships and collaboration is critical to how we move forward.

This next year is going to be tough again as we consistently push ourselves to improve, strengthen, enhance, evolve and develop our sport in order to achieve our ambitions. We want to be the number one team sport for women and girls, using our platform to improve the health and wellbeing of our fans, members and participants, and driving towards a better, fairer future for all in Scotland. We need to move to a more professional model at elite level to capitalize on the opportunities in the growth of women's sport and in our own game, and to become more consistently competitive with the top domestic and International teams on the court. We are aiming to do all of this off of a fragile financial position due to the significant income losses of the past two years, but we cannot deter from our mission, instead we must be smarter in how we go about achieving it.

I must take this time to thank our Board for your unwavering support this past season. Under the leadership of the hugely respected Lucy Faulkner, they are committed to steering this organization through choppy and uncertain waters with courage and ambition. They believe in the potential of this sport and its people and will take the necessary steps to ensure we realise it fully.

To my staff, you are the most agile and innovative team who always step up to deliver what's asked of you, and always do so with positivity and a clear focus on the greater good of the sport and our people. This has been a difficult period for all with lots of change, but with the support and guidance of our incredible COO, Stephanie Karvelis, you have always risen to the challenge and never fail to surprise me with your thinking and ideas.

## Finally to our **Members and Volunteers**

Yet again you have fought for our sport. You have shown up. You have been resilient and creative. You have shared your feedback and sought solutions. You have been flexible. You have trusted in us. 





#### **KEY INCOME BY VALUE 2021-22**




#### **KEY EXPENDITURE BY VALUE 2021-22**



Our focus is still on recovery, and we must prepare ourselves for continued financial pressure as the country hits its own financial pressures around us. I believe we have the skills and expertise to navigate the organisation currently and into the next 4 year cycle.





Commercial income across sports development rose by **40**% but still sits below the pre COVID-19 levels

Investment was made into people over the year including strengthening the Effective Organisation team with the introduction of a COO, Digital team and Partnerships & Sponsorship

Operated at a loss, finishing **-£154k,** with reserves of **£125k** and cash in bank of **£471k**
