

April 2022 - March 2023 period saw a stable return and **increase** of individual members. from **7,959** in **March 2022** to **8,012** in **March 2023**.

All school licenses were re-set in September 2022 as part of a vital data cleanse. This saw a registration of **902 Primary & Secondary** schools have their membership automatically expired on 31st August 2022 requiring them to re-register for the 2022-23 season.

This impacted on overall membership figures reported however by March 2023, 60% of schools had re-registered as engaged Netball Scotland members.






ANTI-DOPING

- The anti-doping team have had another busy year delivering the Netball Scotland Clean Sport Strategy. This strategy is part of the work we must do to comply with Assurance Framework standards given to all NGBs in the UK by UK Anti-doping.
- The team have been busy constructing a new Clean Sport e-learning course, which incorporates UKAD Clean Sport +, for all national, Under-21 and Sirens players. This has now been launched in July 2023 for our Under-21 squad who will attend Netball Europe competition in October.
- We have been happy to get back to face to face education sessions with players, and with the launch of the new elearning course we can now target these sessions to specific topics and scenarios.
- We also had a Clean Sport stall at the World Cup Qualifiers to heighten the awareness of the importance of Clean Sport. This was well attended, and we had many interesting questions.
- We also had a stall at the Sirens match during UKAD Clean Sport Week as the culmination of Clean Sport messages from players and coaches on social media during that week.





NEW - WELLBEING & PROTECTION PANEL

- Review Netball Scotland's Safeguarding Policies to ensure compliance with the Standards for Child Wellbeing & Protection in Sport and current legislation.
- Create a suite of resources to outline Wellbeing & Protection Panel Procedures.
- Convey Wellbeing & Protection Panel Hearings or Appeals as required.
- Assist Netball Scotland's Wellbeing & Protection Officer to deliver training (where appropriate).

FINANCE

- Investment from sportscotland remained level at £610,350 with additional monies in the form of a COVID recovery fund of £40k cash and a £60k repayable grant.
- Membership income **rose** to £154k with the introduction of our new category levels and JustGo rewards scheme. This is the highest percentage growth outside the return to play post COVID.
- Commercial income across sports development whilst on the increase sits below the pre COVID levels.
- The return to spectator events saw the business absorb costs beyond generated income at -£5k
- Overhead and salary costs remained stable at £883k.
- Operated at a loss, finishing -£92k, with reserves of £33k and cash in bank of £350k.
